Knights of Columbus hold 'Running of the Roses'

Prayer services to be held in diocese

ALLOUEZ — The Knights of Columbus is sponsoring its 2017 Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose Program, also known as "Running of the Roses." Beginning last March, six silver roses began a journey across North America, from Canada to the United States and finally to Mexico. The program concludes Dec. 12, the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico.

This year marks the 57th year of the program honoring the Blessed Mother under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe. In 2001, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson expanded the program by beginning the "Running of the Rose" from Toronto, where the Knights held its annual meeting of the Supreme Council.

One of the six roses will pass through Wisconsin from July 16 to Aug. 13. The rose traveling through Wisconsin started its journey in Manitoba on March 5. It will be in the Green Bay Diocese from Sunday, July 30, through Saturday, Aug. 5. The route

includes Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Iowa, Wisconsin, Illinois, Missouri, Arkansas and Texas.

All six silver roses will be joined together in Laredo, Texas. From there they will travel to Mexico and be presented at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico, on Dec. 12.


Bikers hold Rosary Run
